

## Auctioneers' Licences, Auction Permits and House Agents' Licences

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*Reviewed January 2017*

Finance (No. 2) Act, 2008 (Commencement of Section 57(1)) Order 2012 (S.I. No. 227 of 2012) provides for the repeal, with effect from 6<sup>th</sup> July 2012, of provisions relating to Excise Duties on Auctioneers' licences, Auction Permits and House Agents' licences.

Staff should note that with effect from 6<sup>th</sup> July 2012, Revenue is no longer the licensing authority for these licences/permits. These will in future be issued by the Property Services Regulatory Authority. [www.npsra.ie](http://www.npsra.ie)

Accordingly, from this date, Revenue will have no statutory function in relation to compliance in respect of Auctioneers' licences, Auction Permits and House Agents' licences.

Revenue's records for these types of licence should be retained for a period of 6 years, after which the period of retention will be reviewed.
